Cultural Event in the Spanish-speaking world

THE ASSIGNMENT

The cultural essay is designed to allow you to demonstrate your written proficiency in Spanish and cultural knowledge of the Spanish-speaking world. You will write a short paper, in Spanish, of 350-500 words, based on library research, including correct MLA format.

GETTING STARTED

Choose a cultural topic from a Spanish-speaking country, region or that has to do with Spanish-speakers in another country or region and that has significant ties, an impact on, or relationship to the culture of the Spanish-speaking world.

Your instructor must approve your choice and may ask you to revise your topic if he/she feels that either you won't be able to find enough information about your topic or if he/she feels this topic does relate to Spanish, Hispanic and/or Latino culture in a significant way.

Research this event using a minimum of 3 sources:

- At least one of which must be periodical, newspaper or magazine articles from a Spanish language source (from full text newspaper or magazines in original print form or from on-line databases.) OR a Spanish language research database
- At least one of which should be a Spanish language listening based source (YouTube video, news segment, podcast, etc.)
- The other source(s) can be English language resources

Other resources can include:

- Genesee Community College Library Database link: http://guides.genesee.edu/databases
- Specialized cultural encyclopedias or booksBooks
- Spanish language databases available through Livonia Library (linked on Classroom)
- Wikipedia is not a reliable academic source and should not be used

PRESENTATION OF PRELIMINARY RESEARCH

- Working bibliography (list of a minimum of 3 sources, at least one of which must be periodical, newspaper or magazine articles)
- Completion of the Study Guide Questions in Spanish in complete sentences
- Evidence of research in the form of idea map, note cards, vocabulary lists, outline etc.

ESSAY REQUIREMENTS

- Introduction
 - Approximately 100 words
 - A summary of the cultural event, who, what, where, when

• <u>Body</u>

- o Approximately 200-300 words
- o Explain in detail the history and background of the current topic
- o Give specific details about the people involved
- Explain what aspects of Hispanic, Latin or Spanish culture are either illustrated or affected by this event. Consider the way this event illustrates Hispanic, Spanish or Latino culture including values, beliefs, customs, practices, language and/or behavior.
- What are the consequences, possible resolutions or implications regarding the future and this event? (if appropriate to topic)
- Give specific examples, statistics, quotes, etc. that illustrate the importance and impact of this event.
- What comparisons or contrasting elements of culture are represented in this event?

Conclusion

- Personal opinion. What do you think about this event? What would you do if you were part of this society or culture?
- Explain the "so what." Why do we care?
- Why is this event important in our understanding of Hispanic/Spanish/Latino Culture?

Format

- o Minimum 350 words, maximum 500 words in Spanish
- Typed, double-spaced, 12 pt. font, 1 inch margins
- o MLA documentation style for both in-text citations and works cited page

GETTING STARTED ON THE ORAL PRESENTATION

Using your research, make an oral presentation to the class about the person you have chosen to investigate. This is not a reading of your paper.

PRESENTATION REQUIREMENTS

- Content:
 - o Introduction
 - o Summary of cultural event
 - o Discussion of importance of event and impact on society, including specific examples
 - o Explanations of why you chose this topic
 - o Personal reactions to topic
 - Responses to questions from instructor and classmates

• Format:

- Minimum of 5 minutes, maximum of 7 minutes
- o Appropriate use of visual aids (pictures, objects, timeline, Slides, etc.)
- o Appropriate use of memory aids
 - Each slide may have a title, dates and up to 5 words

A NOTE ABOUT ELECTRONIC TRANSLATORS

Electronic translators (translation websites, translation tools, etc.) do not help you to learn how to use the Spanish language effectively and they translate literally which does not result in grammatically correct sentences. Do not use an electronic translation device when writing your paper. If I suspect that you have used an electronic translator or that the work is not your own I will ask you to write a new paper on a new topic under supervision and a penalty will be assessed. If, without a reasonable doubt, the work you turn in is an automatic translation or not your own you will receive a o on this project.

Penalties will be assessed according to instructor guidelines for the following issues.

- Fails to complete all steps in the checklist
- Late work (no work will be accepted that is more than one week late)
- Fails to document sources using MLA Format in-text citations Plagiarism
- Fails to document sources using MLA format works-cited page Plagiarism
- Essays that are too short

Automatic Failure on Essay may occur for any of the following reasons

- Student submits work that is not his/her own (Plagiarized from outside source)
- Presents clear evidence of multiple uses of auto-translation such as, but not limited to, use of Google translate on any piece of the project
- Student submits work that was completed for another class (a prior or concurrent class).
- Paper content is inappropriate.
- Essays that are less than 300 words.
